<p>I, the undersigned, official veterinarian of (Member State of the EU) certify that:</p> <p>II.1. The animal products herein described, comply with the relevant European Union animal health standards and requirements which have been recognised as equivalent to the New Zealand standards and requirements as prescribed in Council Decision 97/132/EC, as last amended, specifically, in accordance with Council Directive 88/407/EEC;</p> <p>II.2. The animal products are eligible for intra-Union trade without restriction;</p> <p>II.3. The bovine semen complies with provisions of the Bluetongue Chapter of the OIE Code;</p> <p>II.4. To the best of my knowledge and as far as I can ascertain, the donors have never recorded a positive test for Q fever.
